*We have identified the most deprived third of all Local Area Districts (i.e. 109 of the current 326 LADs) by ranking LADs according to the proportion of their populations (2005 all age estimates) residing amongst the 20% most deprived small areas in England. Deprivation is measured according to the Indices of Multiple Deprivation 2007, published by the Department of Communities and Local Government taking into account the new unitary authorities from April 2009.

From this list of 109 most deprived, we have excluded 14 LAD areas which are already in receipt of a **myplace** award and have a 13-19 year old population of less than 15,000 based on the Office of National Statistics mid-2007 estimated resident populations.
