

Organisation	Local Authority	Award	Project summary
Aberdeen YMCA	Aberdeen City	£60,000	This grant will help the group sustain and develop their existing mentoring work with young people 8-14 at risk of offending behaviour and exclusion from school. Mentors and mentees will engage with each other by taking part in activities that include trips to the cinema, meals out, trampolining, craft making and cooking. These activities allow for trusting relationships to develop that can have a meaningful impact in young people's lives.
Friends of Craiglockhart Woods and Nature Trail	City of Edinburgh	£42,547	This group will use the funding to appoint a part-time Community Engagement Worker to co-ordinate an expanded programme of educational and leisure activities within Craiglockhart Woods; a local nature reserve in south-west Edinburgh. Targeted activities for older people and people with additional support needs will also be developed to make the greenspace more accessible, as well as a range of new volunteering opportunities for local people.
Nari Kallyan Shangho	City of Edinburgh	£107,047	This group work with South Asian (Indian, Pakistani and Bangladeshi) women and their families living in Edinburgh. The funding will be used to focus on female carers of children and young people with special needs, as well as people with long-term health conditions - many of whom are hidden for a variety of reasons. NKS will provide one to one support to help in managing the caring role and to access services. They will also organise a programme of activities and establish a carers forum.
SafeLives	City of Edinburgh	£400,000	This group will use funding to ensure victims of domestic abuse, particularly those at high risk of serious harm or murder, receive effective and timely support making individuals and families safer sooner. This will be achieved through research and analysis of current practices, and in-depth consultation with survivors and practitioners. This work will also create an evidence base and thematic reports for policy and practice at national and local level therefore improving daily practice.
Tailor Ed Foundation	City of Edinburgh	£120,000	This group will deliver a continuous and connected package of services to families living in Edinburgh raising a child with autism under 16. They provide both the specialised educational methods and the social support required to allow family life to thrive. Families will access a concentrated Early Years programme which feeds into a Follow On Service until age 16.
Inspired Community Enterprise Trust Ltd	Dumfries and Galloway	£389,998	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver a personal development and citizenship transitions programme in its community café (The Usual Place) for young people with learning disabilities, autistic spectrum disorder and additional support needs. These will be young people who need the most time and support to overcome their challenging circumstances. The young people will benefit from by increasing their social connections and confidence.
Barnardo's Scotland	East Ayrshire	£120,506	This group will use the funding to provide support for children and young people (CYP) in East Ayrshire who have experienced bereavement, trauma and loss. Between 25 and 30 CYP aged 11-18 years will engage in one to one support sessions and group work each year to build resilience, capacity to manage and personal growth. Between 40 to 60 parents, carers and professionals will be offered capacity building development each year to build an understanding of how to support CYP who engage in activities.
Kilmarnock Station Railway Heritage Trust	East Ayrshire	£148,487	This group will use the funding to create a wellbeing hub north of Kilmarnock town centre. This will involve refurbishment of a small building recently acquired through community asset transfer turning it into a welcoming space for the local community where they can access a range of wellbeing activities.
Aberlour Child Care Trust	East Lothian	£415,607	This group will use the funding to provide support for women and their families in East Lothian during pregnancy and up to their child's first birthday. Over three years it will work with 180 mothers who are struggling with their emotional health and wellbeing, or have been diagnosed with a low to moderate level of mental illness. It will provide a dedicated trained volunteer who offers support for a minimum of three hours a week plus telephone contact.

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Garadh a Bhagh a Tuath SCIO	Eilean Siar	£830,000	This group advance the care, support and training needs of adults resident on the islands of Barra and Vatersay with disabilities, mental health problems or substance misuse problems. The funding will be used for a new centre which will be used as an administrative hub for local organisations providing services to the adults, which will also become the main site for community interaction and inclusion activities for adults with support needs on Barra and Vatersay.
Fife Gingerbread	Fife	£299,823	This group will use the funding to develop a network of trained and approved Volunteer Buddys throughout Fife to support some of the most vulnerable families and children in their communities. They will create a Fife wide volunteer network and recruit local people to volunteer within the organisation to meet the high demand for those accessing their support services.
SURF-Scotland's Regeneration Forum	Glasgow	£148,260	This group will use the funding to further develop their Alliance for Action programme to engage with local communities over 3 years. Facilitators will work with local people and stakeholders in each of the communities to identify local priorities and need, and then support them to address these. This approach will strengthen community resilience by encouraging connections and joint work between local people, places, partners and assets.
Glasgow University Students Representative Council	Glasgow City	£21,930	This group will train 12 volunteers to deliver suicide prevention workshops to over 600 students and staff. Mind you Mate workshops enable staff and students to identify and listen to fellow students who are experiencing depression and other forms of mental health issues with the aim of reducing suicide and self-harm amongst the student population. The project will significantly increase the number of students and staff with suicide prevention skills and will link at risk students to appropriate help.
In Cahootz Limited	Glasgow City	£143,011	This group will use funding to deliver a theatre and creative arts project to engage marginalised people who are in recovery from addiction. Creative arts workshops/productions will be used to develop people's strengths and promote the valuable contribution they can make to their local communities. Four main events will be produced in Glasgow and will be delivered in partnership with Turning Point Scotland and Addaction.
Parkhead Housing Association Limited	Glasgow City	£400,000	This group will use the funding to complete the final stages of a refurbishment and upgrade of Parkhead Schoolhouse, formerly Parkhead Primary School, making it a sustainable centre. The refurbishment will allow a number of local community groups to co-locate, sharing administrative office space as well as access to rooms from which they can deliver events and activities. Other organisations, local groups and individuals will be able to access a range of rooms and facilities at the centre including a café.
Dementia Friendly Communities CommunityInterest Company	Highland	£112,968	This group will use the funding to sustain their activities and secure their 'Circle of Support' for older people in the communities of Hemsdale, Brora and Golspie. This includes operating the Helmsdale Hub for three days per week for those aged 55 or over who are perhaps lonely, frail, or are experiencing mild cognitive impairment including signs of possible early on-set dementia. This range of socially inclusive work will help to combat loneliness and isolation in a remote, rural community.
Friends of Merkinch Local Nature Reserve	Highland	£120,000	This group will use the funding to develop and train volunteers from the community to take on responsibility for the local reserve and encourage others in the area to use the reserve for a variety of activities. The planned activities over three years includes watching and recording wildlife, learning about biodiversity, and socialising at informal community gatherings. The activity aims to improve accessibility to the reserve and increase the number of people spending time there.
Pulteneytown Peoples Project Limited	Highland	£149,296	This group will use the funding to sustain classes and sessions for the local community in Pulteney Community Centre. Activities include free juice and hot drinks for families on low incomes, woodworking, cooking classes, art sessions and computer lessons. People in the local community of Wick benefit by improving their skills, building up social networks and by feeling valued and needed.
Cumbernauld Action for Care of the Elderly	North Lanarkshire	£360,150	This group will use the funding to continue delivery of their "Older People's Active Lives" project allowing older, lonely and isolated people in the wider Cumbernauld area to continue living in their own homes and providing a comprehensive range of activities to reduce isolation and promote health. Activities will include arts and crafts, reminiscence workshops, recreational activities complemented by men's sheds, monthly tea dances and scheduled trips and outings.

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People United Banton	North Lanarkshire	£738,149	This group will renovate and redevelop the local pub, the Swan Inn, into a multi-purpose community hub. The hub will include a community café, a restaurant, a small volunteer-led shop for basic shopping and post office services. The facility will also provide general community space for activities and events as well as continuing to provide the pub.
Childcare First Limited	Renfrewshire	£150,000	This group will use the funding to continue to deliver Ready Steady Restore, a variety of workshops and play sessions for families in the Ferguslie Park and Shortroods areas of Paisley. In addition to fun and educational activities for children aged 0-8 the project will provide parents with a wide variety of recreational and development activities including peer-support listening sessions, family heritage workshops, and health and wellbeing workshops.
CamGlen Radio	South Lanarkshire	£148,907	This group will use the three years funding to continue and develop CamGlen Radio as a community radio station. Through involvement with the station, local people will build professional skills, social confidence and connections. The project will also continue its volunteering scheme and peer support programme, expand its school radio programme, and develop their equalities work particularly with ethnic minorities.
Clydesdale Community Initiatives	South Lanarkshire	£271,453	This group will use the funding to improve the confidence and social networks of people with mental health issues or additional support needs in South Lanarkshire. By engaging in small social enterprise ventures participants will have the opportunity to take ownership of activities that reflect their interests, experiences and aspirations. During the activities the participants will be provided with personal development support, self-management strategies and coping strategies to support their development.
South Lanarkshire Council	South Lanarkshire	£30,000	This organisation will use this funding to facilitate the active participation of individuals and communities in the neighbourhood planning processes. Through various tools and methods of engagement the group will engage and secure the involvement of local people in identifying priorities, areas for action and solutions around the issues that affects them and their community. This activity will take place over the course of one year in Strutherhill, Springhall and Whitlawburn.
