Aberdeen Cyrenians Limited	Aberdeen City	£401,916	This project will provide females aged 16 years and over who have experienced or are currently experiencing physical, emotional or sexual abuse with the support and skills to enable them to access a range of appropriate services. Services included will be one to one support, safety planning, signposting to appropriate support services, a 12 weeks women's group programme and a befriending service.
Edinburgh Development Group (Scotland)	City of Edinburgh	£346,047	This projects will use the funding to implement an innovative model of self-managed care co-operatives in the Edinburgh area. They have already piloted one such group, the Encompass group, which works with families and support workers of older adults (40-55) with learning difficulties and believe that the model they have developed can be rolled out and adapted for use by other groups. They are aiming to have five groups running and sustainable by the end of the three year award.
Sauchie Community Group	Clackmannanshire	£112,902	This project will, through the introduction of a new post of Community Manager, build the capacity of the group to sustain and expand their programme of activities, develop their outreach provision, increase their volunteer pool ,and work towards improving sustainability prospects through an increased partnership approach.
Dundee Women's Aid	Dundee City	£139,784	This group will use the funding to expand their current services and establish additional support programmes for women who have or are experiencing domestic abuse. Service Users who have completed an initial support package with the organisation will be given the opportunity to progress on to newly established befriending, mentoring or social activity programmes.
Showcase the Street	Dundee City	£149,200	This group will deliver a programme of recreational and educational family based activities from their base in Maryfield, Dundee. This will include a regular after school club which will provide a range of opportunities including arts, sports, cooking, SQA qualifications and a sit down family meal for those involved.
Drumchapel Caravan Project	Glasgow City	£97,500	This group will use the funding to continue offering respite breaks to families facing challenging circumstances. A manager will be employed to build a network of referring organisations, ensure their four holiday homes are used to full capacity and to develop a programme of trips throughout the year.
Freedom From Torture	Glasgow City	£464,600	This project will aim to enhance the current support model by including psycho-social support along with existing therapeutic services. Survivors will also be empowered to identify and share their own strengths, identifying then realising their potential for working with their communities.
The Concrete Garden	Glasgow City	£149,763	This project will extend activities at the organisations Back Garden site to include a family gardening club, outdoor play and cookery sessions for children, a series of family oriented seasonal events, and activities for adults such as grow your own workshops, cookery classes and art activities. They will also build on the skills of volunteers and participants through a programme of peer learning and mentoring.
Skye and Lochalsh Community Care Forum SCIO	Highland	£196,981	This project will improve the lives of young carers by increasing their resilience, wellbeing and sense of belonging. The group will achieve this by identifying the needs and wishes of the beneficiaries, and by providing regular day and residential respite breaks.
Perth & Kinross Association of Voluntary Service	Perth and Kinross	£137,514	This project will support integration and capacity building of migrant communities and individuals. They will provide help in accessing local services, tailored support, cultural training, volunteer development opportunities, ESOL classes and community groups. Participants will be principally from Eastern European, South Asian and Chinese origins.
A Heart for Duns	Scottish Borders	£88,660	This project will further develop the Volunteer Hall in the centre of the town, building on the existing programme of activities and events in response to the wishes of the community and generating income streams to provide sustainable services for the people of the town and its surrounds.
Newcastleton & District Community Trust	Scottish Borders	£320,000	This funding will be used to build an unmanned fuel forecourt at the the front of a new community hub in the village of Newcastleton in the Scottish Borders. The site formerly a disused petrol station will be cleared and a new community hub erected to the rear with the unmanned fuel forecourt to the front of the site, planning permission has been secured for the project and the site will retain the fuel pump operating licence.
Scottish Borders Council	Scottish Borders	£414,085	This funding will be used to bring forward and develop two strands of a elements of a previous project. The Domestic Abuse Advocacy Support Service (DAAS) a short-term crisis intervention service and the Domestic Abuse Community Support Service (DACS) a medium to long-term practical and emotional support service.

Shetland Bereavement Support Service	Shetland Islands	£138,320	This funding will be used to provide a free and confidential bereavement support service to anyone living in Shetland. SBSS aims to address issues of loss, including grief, loneliness and isolation in relation to bereavement. SBSS will provide bereavement training, awareness courses, deliver programmes in schools for children experiencing challenging circumstances and provide memory boxes for families.
Kilbryde Hospice	South Lanarkshire	£128,757	This funding will be used to support people and their carers in South Lanarkshire who have a life limiting illness such as cancer, COPD, Motor Neurone disease. The organisation takes a holistic approach, centred on the needs and expectations of the patients and their families. The multi-disciplinary team will work with patients in the comfort of their own homes to offer advice on how best to control pain and relieve other symptoms.
The Machan Trust	South Lanarkshire	£136,872	This trust will use the grant to develop their volunteering programme, in doing so supporting the community to take increased ownership of the young people's groups facilitated by the Trust. The increased volunteering recruitment and training will be supported by a new Creating Sustainability Officer who will provide local people of all ages, from 14 to adulthood, with the skills and confidence they need to take the lead in delivering activities.
Voluntary Action South Lanarkshire	South Lanarkshire	£334,811	This project will support young people aged 16-29 who are living with multiple complex challenges including mental health issues, offending behaviour, substance misuse, risk taking, self-harm and isolation. Chance 2 Change will, through mentoring, personal goal setting and group work support young people to manage their personal circumstances so that they have the life skills they need to overcome their personal life challenges.
The Leamy Foundation	West Dunbartonshire	£134,148	This group will use the funding to continue their community-based gardening activities, with a new focus on mental health and wellbeing that will include a programme of informal group work and self-help tools.
Brock Garden Centre SCIO	West Lothian	£149,900	This group supports people who have a severe and enduring mental illness. The project will focus on the personal recovery journey of participants by building on their skills to make a long-term difference in people's lives and promoting recovery in the broadest sense. Support will be provided formally by trained staff as well as informally by peers, with volunteering and mentoring opportunities available.
